

**MINUTES**  
**DETROIT CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING**  
**June 14, 2022**

The Detroit City Council met in, regular session on Tuesday, June 14, 2022 at 6:33 P.M. Mayor Kenny Snodgrass called the meeting to order. Council members in attendance were Shane Cabler, Terrie Shelby, Faye Marshall and Lori Melton.

No public in attendance for public comment

New business discussed:

- Discussion and consideration for re-opening Union St from 410 N – to N. Main – a community member had purchased 2 lots that border the currently closed section of Union St. He has stated that he intends to build and reside there in the future. The road had been closed years ago after excessive and abusive ATV and truck traffic had made the road impassible. There is an accessible water main along the property, but the nearest sewer main in under N. Main St. No action was taken at this time.

Old Business discussed/actioned:

- Moving City Hall to Library – Internet and Phone set up has been initiated and is partially complete

Motion was made by Shane Cabler and seconded by Lori Melton to approve the regular monthly bills along with:

- Pumps & Power Company – (2) 4” sewer pumps and freight for Sand Diego lift station - \$6,130.06
- Swaim Hardware – sewer pump cable, 24’ ladder, cordless drill - \$606.01
- Decker Repair – pulling & cleaning pumps – San Diego & E. Deport lift station - \$600.00
- Prestige Worldwide Technologies, LLC – repair automatic valve at the master meter - \$1,499.95
- Triple S Electric – service call to disconnect pump on Norris St. - \$205.00
- Decker repair – installing new pumps San Diego lift station - \$240.00
